

Associate Professor Mary Coloe PBVM is a Presentation Sister and a Scripture scholar and teacher of international repute. Mary has been an educator in different capacities, here and overseas. She is currently Associate Professor Yarra Theological Union and Head of the Department Biblical Studies, University of Divinity (Melbourne).

In the interests of adult education in Scripture Mary has developed a one page website that gives details on her books and articles.

Fr Francis Moloney SDB



Francis J. Moloney, SDB (DPhil, University of Oxford), is Senior Professorial Fellow at Catholic Theological College, University of Divinity, in Melbourne, Australia. He is the former Provincial Superior of the Salesians of Don Bosco for Australia and the Pacific region and formerly taught at Australian Catholic University and the Catholic University of America. Father Moloney is a Fellow of the Australian Academy of the Humanities, a Member of the Order of Australia, and the author of more than forty books.



Inspiration for the Road Ahead ...



Perhaps one of the most well-known opening sentences of a book are these from *A Tale of Two Cities* by Charles Dickens:

It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us ...

Very similar comments could be made about the Church in Australia today as we await the recommendations of the Royal Commission and begin planning for the Plenary Council in 2020.

Perhaps these words from Pope Francis, on a similar theme, may inspire us and keep our direction firm and resolute, humble and compassionate:

We do well to keep in mind the early Christians and our many brothers and sisters throughout history who were filled with joy, unflagging courage and zeal in proclaiming the Gospel. Some people nowadays console themselves by saying that things are not as easy as they used to be, yet we know that the Roman empire was not conducive to the Gospel message, the struggle for justice, or the defence of human dignity. Every period of history is marked by the presence of human weakness, self-absorption, complacency and selfishness ... These things are ever present under one guise or another; they are due to our human limits rather than particular situations. Let us not say, then, that things are harder today; they are simply different. But let us learn also from the saints who have gone before us, who confronted the difficulties of their own day.
