

His first 'catch' was his book *Where the Hell is God?*, his second with the next book, *Why Bother Praying?* — and now for his third book, *What are we Doing on Earth for Christ's Sake?*. The title of each book can be perceived as confrontational and flippant. However, in the introduction of each book Leonard recounts a story from his life when the 'title' was spoken to him in a significant conversation — the first by his mother, the second by a friend who had been a fellow student and the third by a fellow passenger on a flight across the US.

In so many ways this book is a delight to read – whether Leonard is writing about his first parish of St Canice's near Kings Cross, or responding to the attack on religion by modern-day atheists, or indeed the very question of 'what's the point of faith today for Christ's sake?'.

INSPIRATION FOR THE ROAD AHEAD ... FROM PRAISE BE TO YOU (222, 223)

Christian spirituality proposes an alternative understanding of the quality of life, and encourages a prophetic and contemplative lifestyle, one capable of deep enjoyment free of the obsession with consumption. We need to take up an ancient lesson, found in different religious traditions and also in the Bible. It is the conviction that 'less is more'. A constant flood of new consumer goods can baffle the heart and prevent us from cherishing each thing and each moment.

To be serenely present to each reality, however small it may be, opens us to much greater horizons of understanding and personal fulfilment.

Christian spirituality proposes a growth marked by moderation and the capacity to be happy with little. It is a return to that simplicity which allows us to stop and appreciate the small things, to be grateful for the opportunities which life affords us, to be spiritually detached from what we possess, and not to succumb to sadness for what we lack. This implies avoiding the dynamic of dominion and the mere accumulation of pleasures.

Such sobriety, when lived freely and consciously, is liberating. It is not a lesser life or one lived with less intensity. On the contrary, it is a way of living life to the full.
