Please promote the website through parish bulletins and social media. Under the 'Reflections' tab you will find the videos of the Gospel Reflections; under the 'Stories' tab you will find the six videos of the 'Good News People'; and under the 'PowerPoint' tab you will find the artwork (Sr Orsolya Fecske SSS) suitable for a PowerPoint slide for each Sunday. For information on Sr Orsolya and her remarkable community of sisters in Hungary look under the 'Art' tab.

For a whole variety of reasons probably less than 5% of parishioners will join a Lenten group. Through promoting the website potentially 90% of parishioners could receive formation in the Lenten scriptures at home (on computer, tablet, phone or even the new 'smart' TVs) or while commuting to work.

The 'Good News People' stories are not restricted to Lent but would make an excellent formation series on themes such as Christian mission, discipleship, vocation and ministry, eg Peter Duffy talking about his transition from surgeon to retirement; his engagment in parish ministries and his hope to be involved with Orange Sky Laundry.

John Pridmore



An inspiring story for the Lenten journey. John visited Australia and spoke in Brisbane. In an <u>interview on EWTN</u> John shares his remarkable story. His life fell apart at the age of ten when his parents divorced. His fear of that emotional pain caused him to take a 'vow' to never love anyone again. This began a life of crime and violence. As an adult he was deeply enmeshed in the drug trade and gang world of London. What he regarded as an unremarkable day – a day in which he bashed someone within an inch of his life – began a slow, and often painful, journey to faith in Jesus Christ and the Catholic Church. Today he lives in a community in Ireland and gives presentations and formation around the world. John is deeply reflective and spiritual. He has a strong Marian piety which often seems incongrous with his strong East End gangland accent.

Theology in the City · Lecture Series 2017 · Culture of encounter: seeking common ground



<u>Topic 2:</u> (Tue 28 March) *Dignitatis Humanae - Religious freedom in Catholic thought*Speaker: Dr David Kirchhoffer - Lecturer in Theology, ACU and Catholic representative on the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity

Dr Kirchhoffer will talk about the development of Catholic thought around the human right of religious freedom. That is, the right of all persons to be free to either follow or not a particular religious tradition as a part of civil society. He will be doing this by particularly looking at the Vatican II document of Digitatis Humanae promulgated in 1965 by Pope Paul VI.





Do You Love Me? A Practical Guide to Catholic Prayer and Spirituality



This is a very engaging and attractive full colour book – slightly larger than A5 size and 86 pages.

It was written by a working party of the Spirituality Committee of the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales after many requests for a handbook on Christian spirituality. The six chapters cover the universal themes of: Searching, Recognising, Experiencing, Conversing, Following, Choosing.

This is not a dense theological work but as the title suggests it is a highly 'practical', hands-on text. The language is highly accessible and the 'Way-In' opening section gets the reader thinking about an experience or photos in the book to begin the chapter. Wonderful for an individual or a group. The 'All Together' section provides questions for reflection or group discussion. This is an ideal resource for RCIA and any parishioner seeking to deepen their prayer life and spirituality.

Published by the Catholic Truth Society. \$14.95. The Bishops have generously provided a link to the full text of *Do You Love Me? A Practical Guide to Catholic Prayer and Spirituality.*
